Amal's public talks have taken them to stages around the world including the World Social Forum in Brazil, the Left Forum in New York and numerous other large convergences, conferences and global assemblies. They regularly provide keynote talks on moving beyond diversity to organizational transformation, understanding systemic inequities as public and workplace health issues, visioning decolonial futures for our communities and many other topics.
